



The same strain of human papillomavirus (HPV) responsible for cervical, penile and anal cancer is now a leading cause of head and neck cancer. In fact, HPV-related cancers of the tonsil region and base of the tongue, or oropharynx, have tripled in the past several decades. Patients more affected are those between the ages of 40 and 60, who often have no obvious risk factors for cancer.

Scoliosis and Spinal Deformity Center Now Open

Patients with spine issues now have a new resource for cutting-edge care: The Scoliosis and Spinal Deformity Center. The center is home to a specialized team of orthopedic spine surgeons, neurosurgeons and other medical professionals at both Morristown and Overlook medical centers who can handle conditions ranging from patients with mild spine curvature to more advanced spinal deformity cases.

The care team creates individualized treatment plans designed to each patient's particular deformity pattern. Treatments range from growth preservation techniques for scoliosis treatment, genetic testing to predict potential curve progression, as well as more traditional treatment options such as bracing or spinal fusion.

The center's advanced technology allows the surgical team to see CT images in real time, ensuring surgeons are guiding the hardware to the right location with pinpoint accuracy – critical for complex spinal surgeries.

Mapping the Future for Patient Care

Clinical research trials improve cancer treatments and outcomes

> dvances in the treatment of cancer continue to improve with the help of clinical research trials like those conducted at Atlantic Health System. "Most clinical trials are related to chemotherapy," says Steve Halpern, MD, director, Pediatric Oncology Center. "Because of that, we've changed the way the chemotherapy is given to help better kill the cancer cells. But now, we're seeing more targeted therapy used in conjunction with chemotherapy."

> In targeted therapy, the unique properties of the cancer cell are attacked directly. "We had a child recently who had the most common type of leukemia. We treated her with one round of chemotherapy, and it didn't work. She got sick and lost her hair and was in the hospital quite a bit," says Dr. Halpern. "We then gave her targeted therapy once a week as an outpatient. She felt much better within a short time and after just three weekly treatments of this targeted therapy, the leukemia was completely eradicated." For more information, please call 973-971-6720.

In addition to the pediatric cancer research, we are conducting clinical studies in adults at Atlantic Health System's Overlook Medical Center. Overlook Medical Center is the only hospital in New Jersey involved in the MIND Study of Artemis' minimally invasive neuro evacuation device to remove intracerebral hemorrhage. The device is inserted through a small incision into the affected area of the brain and removes the clot by suctioning it out through a catheterlike device. The study is open to patients 18 to 80 years old with an intracerebral hemorrhage.

"Our interventionalist team has performed about 60 of these procedures using the Artemis device over a two-year period and has seen an increase in survival rate with the device pre-trial," according to principal investigator Paul Saphier, MD, an endovascular neurosurgeon for the Atlantic Neuroscience Institute. "We are proud to be a major participant in this trial, as well as many others, that provide a benefit to our patients." For more information, call 833-733-4641. 🚄

Life After Double Hip Replacement

Charlene Beebe feels fitter than ever

Several years ago, Atlantic Health System joint replacement specialist Paul Lombardi, MD, told his patient, Charlene Beebe of Sparta, something unusual: Though only in her 40s, she needed both hips replaced. The stakes were high. Charlene's work and passion are as a personal trainer, group fitness instructor and nutrition coach. She works six days a week, managing over 55 clients.

"I needed to get back to work without any problems," she says. "I thrive on guiding my clients to reach their goals, and I didn't want to slow down at all," she says.

GRADUAL CHANGE

Charlene's pain had been getting worse over the years before she finally visited Dr. Lombardi. In her first visit, he diagnosed the problem as a congenital defect, something she was born with.

"He told me that the only treatment was to replace both joints, but he left the decision of 'when' up to me," she says. "I appreciated that."

WITHOUT THE PAIN

Charlene says she gained a great level of trust in him. "He had a very positive attitude," she says. "I knew I would be back to doing what I love - without the pain."

Dr. Lombardi replaced both hips in surgeries just eight months apart. Recovery was quick, and Charlene has returned to her full schedule of personal training, teaching, motivating and inspiring.

"I shouldn't have waited so long to have it done," she says. "I could not have asked for a better outcome, and everyone at Atlantic Health was fantastic from beginning to end."



WELL PREPARED -ALWAYS PREPARED

Morristown Medical Center provides award-winning trauma care

hen a child or adult with serious injuries arrives at a hospital by ambulance or helicopter, time is a critical factor. For those arriving at Morristown Medical Center, a specialized trauma team awaits.

They have among the highest levels of preparation in the state to investigate traumatic injuries, to quickly determine the best treatment and then assemble the right team of professionals to begin emergency care.

25 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE

Every day, the trauma team cares for severely injured or critically ill people. Injuries can range from broken bones and brain injuries to damaged internal organs from motor vehicle crashes to stabbings and gunshot wounds.

Morristown Medical Center first became verified as a Trauma Center 25 years ago as part of a voluntary program of the American College of Surgeons (ACS). It is one of only four in the state to earn the highest ACS verification, Level I Trauma Center. The state of New Jersey also designates it as a Trauma Center.

SPECIALISTS AVAILABLE 24/7

Consistent with Trauma Center guidelines, the staff at Morristown Medical Center's Trauma Center includes a variety of highlevel specialists who are available at all times of day and night. These include trauma surgeons with extensive training in general and critical care surgery, trauma nurses and a surgical intensive care unit.

Supporting this core team are orthopedic surgeons, neurosurgeons, plastic surgeons, specialists in cardiology and other specialists. For children, pediatric surgery specialists provide care in a special pediatric emergency room and pediatric intensive care unit.

Through a combination of experienced staff, dedicated treatment areas and a strong network of specialty support, the staff at Morristown Medical Center is well prepared – and always prepared – to care for seriously injured patients of all ages.

LEADING THE FIGHT AGAINST LUNG CANCER

This quiz could save your lungs – and your life. Answer these four quick questions:

- 1. DO YOU SMOKE?
- 2. ARE YOU A FORMER SMOKER?
- 3. HAVE YOU BEEN EXPOSED TO SECONDHAND SMOKE?
- 4. DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO WOULD ANSWER "YES" TO THE QUESTIONS ABOVE?

If you answered "yes" even one time, lung specialists at Atlantic Health System have news that could improve your health or the health of someone you know.

"Our biggest success in treating lung cancer is when we find it early, so we've put screening programs in place to accomplish that," says Mark Widmann, MD, director of the lung cancer program for Carol G. Simon Cancer Centers at both Morristown and Overlook medical centers. "For decades, we've been at the forefront of efforts like this, and we offer some of the most advanced screenings and treatments available anywhere."

For example, as part of a research trial, Atlantic Health System offers people exposed to secondhand smoke the unusual option to get a screening.

DEMONSTRATING QUALITY

For any screening and treatment, the experience of the staff is important, Dr. Widmann says. Lung cancer specialists at Atlantic Health System have earned high marks in several national rankings.

"Choose a program that can demonstrate its focus on quality," he says. "Lung cancer specialists at Morristown see more patients than any other program in the state, and we have among the highest quality scores as well."

GOT 10 MINUTES?

Because lung cancer is the No. 1 cancer killer in the U.S., screenings to find it early could help thousands of people. However, only two out of 10 people with lung cancer find it early, when it is most easily treated.

Specialists at Atlantic Health System offer two screenings to address this issue. Both involve a low-dose CT scan that takes less than 10 minutes.

For smokers and former smokers, the lung cancer screening program at Atlantic Health System focuses on people between the ages of 55 and 77 who do not have lung cancer. See if you qualify for this service: call 1-855-862-2778.



Soothing Paws®

Pet Therapy Is Worth Barking About

ealth care is going to the dogs.

And before you think that's a bad thing, you need to experience Soothing Paws in person.

With 85 dog and handler teams in our program, Soothing Paws is making a difference in the lives of patients and hospital staff by providing stress relief when it's needed most. In addition to scheduled rounds at each hospital in Atlantic Health System, visits are available by request for most patients, their families and visitors.

"We're constantly stopped in the halls so patients, families and hospital employees can kneel down, pet and talk to our dogs," says Mildred Kowalski, PhD, RN, the Morristown nurse researcher who manages the Soothing Paws Program. "Because our dogs are so gentle and loving, they provide immediate and enduring comfort. It's an absolutely amazing form of therapy."

The pups are so popular they even have their own trading cards, which are handed out (along with hand sanitizer) following each and every therapy encounter. How popular is Soothing Paws? In 2017, our dog-handler teams averaged 200 visits per month to patients in need of smiles across all medical centers in the system.



"The program is a huge success and continues to grow in popularity since it began in 2007," says Kowalski. "We're always looking for new dogs, so consider joining the program if you have a loving pet. It's a very rewarding way to volunteer."

All dogs in the program must be registered after a training process and most, but not all, are handled by their volunteer owners.


"The stigma surrounding mental health has gone on for far too long," says Director of Atlantic Behavioral Health Lori Ann Rizzuto, LCSW. "Many people don't want to admit they are struggling – often they are embarrassed or ashamed. This feeling of isolation has to end, which is why this program was

developed and why it's so important for our community."

No More Whispers is motivated to get people talking openly about a condition that affects one in six U.S. adult lives, according to the National Institute of Mental Health. Through printed materials, presentations and community outreach efforts, No More Whispers will enhance awareness and engage influencers throughout New Jersey about the importance of access to mental health care.

"So many communities are doing amazing work already," says Rizzuto. "We want to integrate our efforts with theirs. Our message is clear: We all need to address this challenge together by encouraging those in need to ask for help."

Your Support Makes a Difference

Twenty years ago, the doors opened to Carol G. Simon Cancer Center, a legacy of William E. Simon and his wife, Carol, longtime volunteers at Morristown Medical Center. Today, over 3,000 new cancer patients are diagnosed or treated each year at the center, with annual outpatient visits totaling 113,000. The center has grown through the recruitment of top specialists and perpetually expanding research and trials.

With contemporary advancements comes the need for renovation. "We have to design a building that more accurately reflects the flow of cancer care today," says medical director Eric D. Whitman, MD. "It involves better support and logistics, from diagnosis, through treatment and continuing into survivorship. As scary as a cancer diagnosis can be, our building has to make it easier and more comforting for patients and their families during their cancer care journey."

The center will experience a floorby-floor transformation over the next two years, beginning with an

expanded 36-bay infusion center on the third floor. "We've spent the most time in perfecting the infusion center design, speaking repeatedly with patients, nurses, advocacy groups and physicians," says Dr. Whitman. "During treatment, that's where many patients spend the most time, and it is crucial for us to create the safest, most healing environment possible."

On the first floor, in addition to the Aresty Radiation Therapy Center and Leonard B. Kahn Head and Neck Cancer Institute, patients will find one central registration area and have access to a dispensing pharmacy, supportive care services, lab testing and a fast track area to receive port flushes and injections. The second floor will house multidisciplinary clinics. Rather than sending patients around the hospital for appointments, their assigned care

team will be centralized, promoting collaboration and productivity. The fourth floor remains home to Ripple Breast Center and the research and registry teams. The remainder of the space will be used for conference rooms and physician and administrative offices.

The renovated building ties into a far-reaching vision that includes an increased focus on the latest research. The motivation is simple.

"It's personal for us," says Missak Haigentz, MD, chief of hematology and oncology for Morristown Medical Center. His colleague, Angela Alistar, MD, an internationally respected pancreatic cancer expert, adds, "We're here to fight cancer, and we're here to win."
